ABSTRACT. The UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are perhaps the most ambitious attempt to date at global monitoring of human well-being. They combine economic, social and environmental dimensions, with a particular emphasis on social inclusion. This lecture will focus especially on the extent to which SDG 5 – which aims at Gender Equality – can help ensure food security, within and beyond households. It will also explore the relationship of SDG 5 with several other goals which impinge centrally on the question of food security, but many of which pay no attention to gender equality.

The lecture will argue that although SDG 5 holds substantial potential, it also has serious limitations in promoting food security on its own. There is a need not only to link SDG 5 with the SDGs which focus on poverty and hunger, but also to create synergies between SDG 5 and goals relating to environmental sustainability, such as climate change, forest ecosystems, and marine resources. In turn, we may ask: can the environmental goals themselves be achieved without a focus on gender equality and the synergies inherent therein? Finally, the lecture will examine factors beyond those included in the SDGs in particular institutional innovations in agriculture – attention to which could open up new pathways for both empowering women and achieving food security.

BINA AGARWAL is a Professor of Development Economics and Environment at the University of Manchester, and former Director and Professor of Economics at the Institute of Economic Growth, Delhi. She has held distinguished positions at Harvard, Princeton, Michigan, Minnesota and New York, and been President of the International Society for Ecological Economics, Vice-President of the International Economic Association, and President of the International Association for Feminist Economics.

Agarwal's publications include 13 books and 85 professional papers on subjects such as environment and development; property and land rights; the political economy of gender; agriculture, technology and institutions; and poverty and inequality. Her recent books include *Gender and Green Governance* (Oxford University Press, 2010) and *Gender Challenges*, a three-volume compendium of her selected papers (Oxford University Press, 2016).

In 2016, Agarwal was elected an international member of the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei. She holds honorary doctorates from ISS, The Hague, and the University of Antwerp. In 2008, she received a Padma Shri from the President of India. She has also received many awards for her research, including the 1994 Edgar Graham Book Prize; the 2005 Ramesh Chandra Award; the 2002 Malcolm Adiseshiah Award; the 2010 Leontief Prize; and in 2017 the Order of Agricultural Merit, France, the Louis Malassis Prize, and the International Balzan Prize.
